11. Significant contributions made by IQAC during the current year (maximum five bullets)

The IQAC launched an extensive Green Audit of the campus, encompassing both Energy and Environmental Audits. This initiative aims to identify and implement sustainable practices, reduce the

institution's carbon footprint, and foster a culture of environmental responsibility among students and staff.

To cultivate entrepreneurial skills, few departments of the College organized exhibition cum sale programs and programs like Earn while Learn were promoted by different College committees. These events provided students with practical experience in business management, marketing, and sales, thus enhancing their entrepreneurial mindset and readiness for the competitive job market. The IQAC also helped in getting operative a fully functional computer lab with the capacity of 150 computers.

The institution runs 11 certificate/ diploma courses. This year the college introduced two six-month courses, "Certificate Course in Indian Classical Dance-Kathak" and "Basic Computer Application Course" aimed at instilling technical and ethical values along side essential life skills in students. These courses are designed to promote personal growth, self-awareness, and holistic well-being, preparing students to navigate life's challenges with resilience and integrity.

A Mentor-Mentee system was established to address the academic challenges faced by students and to enhance their knowledge base. This system provides personalized guidance and support, fostering a nurturing educational environment where students can thrive academically and personally.

The college signed many Memorandum of Understanding (MOUs) of academic and health care support with esteemed organizations. These MOUs aim to develop the employability of students and working professionals, offer counseling and training, and promote mutual understanding of objectives and goals among Higher Education Institutions (HEIs). Such collaborations are instrumental in aligning educational programs with industry standards and societal needs, thereby enhancing the overall educational experience and career prospects of students.

15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

The college fosters a rich interdisciplinary environment, integrating subjects from both Arts and Social Sciences. At the undergraduate level, B.A. Part I and II students choose three subjects along with an ancillary and language in the Social Science stream and three subjects with Soft Skills and language in the Arts stream. Additionally, all undergraduates (social science) are required to study an Indian language and a foreign language. In B.A. Part III, students focus on their Honours subject and Environmental Studies. The college enhances the learning experience through well-equipped laboratories in the Departments of Home Science, Psychology and Geography alongside a dedicated Computer and Statistic Lab. The College provides separate practical rooms for the departments of Music (Vocal), Music (Instrumental) & Painting. Regular interdisciplinary lectures, workshops, and seminars are organised in collaboration with external institutions and various departments within the college. The competitions organized for the students also emphasize on the topics which are interdisciplinary in nature and facilitate a holistic learning experience. These initiatives significantly enhance the knowledge and skills of both students and faculty, ensuring they stay abreast of the latest developments in their respective fields. The college cultural forum organizes academic and cultural competitions on the subjects related to various disciplines.

16. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The college recognizes the critical role of the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) System in modern education, emphasizing the importance of digital registration for managing academic accounts, credit verification, accumulation, transfer, and redemption. By promoting ABC among stakeholders and integrating it with online programs and forthcoming initiatives like the National Credit Framework, the college aims to enhance the flexibility and efficiency of credit management given that the college operates under the privileges of Banaras Hindu University (BHU). The curriculum design is aligned

with the parent body and separate registration in ABC is not required for VKM students, as they are already registered under BHU. This alignment ensures that students benefit from a streamlined and robust academic framework, facilitating a seamless educational experience.

17.Skill development:

The college is deeply committed to the skill development of its students, offering a range of programs designed to enhance both technical and soft skills. To improve communicative abilities, the college runs certificate and diploma courses in spoken English. The Sanskrit 'Vagvardhini Sabha' held each semester, familiarizes students with the nuances of Sanskrit. Throughout the year, various competitions in debate, poetry recitation, elocution, essay writing, and turncoat debates are conducted to ensure fluency in Hindi, English, and Sanskrit. Additionally, a Diploma course in Fashion Designing is offered to promote self-employment. The college also provides soft skill courses in Yoga, Logic, Music (Vocal and Instrumental), and Painting for B.A. Arts students. Workshops, lectures, and seminars on diverse topics such as Research Methodology, Communication Skills, Writing Skills, Waste Management, Stress Management, and various arts and crafts are regularly organized to broaden students' competencies. A certificate course on self-realisation through Theosophy, Lanquill, Katthak dance and Computer education instills technical, moral and ethical values. Moreover, MOU with Young Skilled India (YSIID Solutions Pvt. Ltd) enriches students with skills in HR, Marketing, Finance, Operations, IT, Yoga Life Coaching, Project Management, Tourism & Hospitality, Educational Management & Administration, and AI & ML Management. These comprehensive initiatives ensure that students are well-prepared for their future careers and personal development.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

The college strives to blend tradition with modernity aiming to preserve ancient Indian tradition while promoting a scientific outlook among students. To cultivate an awareness of India's rich heritage, the college, jointly with the Indian National Trust for Art and Cultural Heritage (INTACH) organizes educational visits to archaeological sites and heritage walks. Despite Sanskrit's divine origin and status as the world's most scientific language, it has lost prominence in its homeland. The college addresses this by offering Sanskrit as a subject and hosting programs like 'Sanskrit Sambhashan Shivir' and 'Chandogaan Karyashala' through the Department of Sanskrit. Various departments in both Arts and Social

Sciences also teach ancient Indian philosophies and the contributions of Indian philosophers. Seminars and workshops and lectures are regularly organized to imbue Indian values and ethos in students and staff. The diploma course in Kathak Dance enriches the Indian Knowledge System by preserving and promoting cultural heritage and traditional values. Celebrations such as International Mother Language Day, Hindi Saptah and Pakhwara, Heritage day & Heritage week, anniversaries of notable Indian thinkers and saints further promote cultural integration. The College also promotes celebrations meant for different seasons such as 'Shravanotsava' and 'Varshamangal' to inculcate understanding of hindu cycle of time. Additionally, courses on Yoga and Self Realization Through Theosophy (in hybrid mode) align with the NEP 2020, which is in the process of being implemented, reinforcing the college's commitment to integrating India's profound knowledge systems into its academic framework. To encompass the broad area of Indian Knowledge System, a six month certificate course on 'Indology' is proposed from the coming session.

19.Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

The college is dedicated to implementing outcome-based education (OBE), bridging the gap between theoretical knowledge and practical application. To promote OBE, the college conducts various activities, ensuring that course/topics are relevant to real-life examples through lectures, seminars, and workshops organized by each department. Practical exposure to the learner is ensured through extension activities such as NSS and UBA. Academic and cultural platforms like Manaswini, Antiquity, Elysium, ELC, Itivritt, Ecotalk, Besant club, Women Study Cell (Udaan), Ocean Shell and Sarjana etc. host competitions designed with course, programme, and programme-specific outcomes in mind. The Guidance and Counselling Cell plays a pivotal role by organizing career counselling sessions and workshops on NET/SLET, Banking, Civil Services, and more, enhancing students' skills and employability by making them aware of eligibility criteria and examination processes. The Training and Placement Cell, in collaboration with the Banaras Hindu University placement cell, facilitates employment drives, providing students with ample job opportunities. Furthermore, students gain hands-on experience and develop essential skills such as leadership, teamwork, and data management through internships with social organizations that the college has partnered with. Ancillary courses in creative writing and communication skills complement literary studies, ensuring that students graduate with a well-rounded education tailored to achieving specific educational outcomes. This comprehensive approach not only equips students with the necessary

skills for their professional careers but also fosters social responsibility and personal growth.

20.Distance education/online education:

Taking advantage of easy and impactful accessibility of online education, the college adopted the shift to online teaching along with classroom teaching to ensure uninterrupted knowledge transfer. The college works through the learning tools like Google Classroom, Google Meet and Teachmint. Lectures on various subjects are uploaded to the YouTube channels personal as well as institutional. The college also offers the SWAYAM programme. National and international lectures, webinars, and workshops were held in the current academic session in hybrid mode. The college library is automated, providing students with 24/7 access to over 6000 e-journals and more than 1,99,500 e-books through NLIST. Platforms such as e-PG Pathshala and E-Gyankosh further enriched the learning experience. Even the programs of National Service Scheme (NSS) and competitions in the College Cultural Fest 'Sarjana' were conducted in hybrid mode, ensuring that students' social responsibilities and creative development continues unabated. The alumni meet "Avartan", was also held in hybrid mode, featuring participation from national and international alumni who shared their experiences and insights, thereby inspiring and enriching the current students. This seamless integration of technology in education demonstrated the college's resilience and commitment to providing a comprehensive and uninterrupted learning experience. The feedback mechanism of the college involves online feedback submission from the stakeholders regarding academic and other related facilities to further improve upon existing system.

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

Vasant Kanya Mahavidyalaya follows the curriculum formed by the University Board of Studies, Banaras Hindu University. A meeting is held by the Principal with the department heads at the start of each session to discuss various methods for the successful implementation of the curriculum. An academic and cultural calendar for co-curricular and extracurricular events is also prepared. Additionally, the departments hold internal meetings, prepare methodologies for the next academic term, and are motivated to organize educational tours, industry visits, field excursions, guest lectures, and other activities. Teachers incorporate modern teaching techniques, interactive lectures engaging students through various methods to keep them actively involved during the lecture, group discussions, presentations, workshops, and seminars, in addition to their usual lesson plans. The departments stay in contact with their respective University departments/faculties regarding the curriculum's successful implementation. The college has a fully automated library with

books, journals, CDs, N-List access via INFLIBNET, important publications, archival resources and newspapers to meet the academic needs of the students. Frequent evaluations are designed to track the effectiveness of the curriculum, measure student outcomes, and incorporate feedback for continuous improvement. This process involves regular assessments, feedback collection, and data analysis to ensure that the educational objectives are being met.

1.3 - Curriculum Enrichment**1.3.1 - Institution integrates crosscutting issues relevant to Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, Environment and Sustainability into the Curriculum**

The college is dedicated to establish a strong foundation of ethics among students. Various aspects of professional ethics are part of the rich curricula, which are further enhanced by internship programs that offer practical experience in real-world work contexts. In addition to this, the college focuses on the cultivation of a strong moral persona and a sense of fairness through inter-college competitions, sports activities, NSS involvement, and cultural events.

Gender studies are integrated into the curriculum of most subjects, addressing critical topics including gender issues, sensitization, women's empowerment, and equality. Also interactive lectures regarding women empowerment and safety are held in the college. Yoga and self-defense classes promote health and safety skills among the girls.

The college endorses "Saty?nn?sti Paro Dharma" emphasizing truth as the highest virtue, and embeds teachings on human values through its curricula. Students of Home Science, Psychology, and Sociology engage in extension activities by visiting and offering assistance in centers for the specially-abled, old age homes, orphanages, and rural areas, thereby promoting awareness and empathy.

Furthermore, environmental knowledge and awareness is promoted in the students. A special paper is offered on Environmental Studies where the students develop an understanding about the environment and sustainability. The curriculum of various departments are designed in such a way that focus is kept on environmentally responsible practices, such as reusing, recycling, creating products from waste, textile processing and sensitizing towards environment. Also, the Go Green Committee is specifically designated for the cause.

The institution is committed to the rich and focused enhancement of all students by grouping them into slow and advanced learning

capabilities and targeting each group with tailored actions.

For slow learners, the institution offers extra classes and personal interactions with teachers to reinforce concepts. 2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

Being admitted to the privileges of Banaras Hindu University, the guidelines and regulations of the University pertaining to internal/external assessment is followed. The internal assessment of 30 marks comprises sessional tests, assignment and attendance, while the external assessment consists of a written examination of 70 marks based on the complete prescribed syllabus of the paper. Teachers constantly announce these guidelines to the students. Students are informed that their internal assessment will be based on class performance, regularity, tests, assignments, quizzes, and viva voce, conducted in both written and verbal formats. They are familiarized with the semester examination pattern and the distribution of marks for internal and external examinations. The examination process adheres to a transparent method.

Each semester, internal exams are conducted in a structured manner and in definite frequency by preparing a schedule according to which the tests are held. The Principal meets the Heads of Departments and the IQAC Coordinator to discuss the roadmap and to design an effective implementation procedure involving all faculty members. The mechanism and evaluation techniques are constantly explained to students. This ensures a clear and consistent assessment process, aligning with the university's standards.

In order to create and enhance the infrastructure that facilitates effective teaching and learning, the college forms a policy according to the strength of its students. As per requirement, the institution approaches its Managing Committee and seeks funds for honorary teachers to facilitate the teaching process. The infrastructural enhancement is liberally funded by our Management on need base and availability of funds. At the institutional level, the college has adopted techniques to make teaching more effective. All the books are bar-coded. The issue and return of books is done with barcode scanner. College has federated searching tools to search articles in multiple

resources. In the year 2021, the college obtained static IP Address for the library, which facilitated users to access library resources, both within and without the campus. The library is in the process to start e-gate attendance for the students of the college. In the year 2023-24 a total number of 663 books were added to the library collection which includes both reference and text books. The library is completely digitalized and has adopted the integrated library management system. The wi-fi facility is provided through out the campus. The computer configuration is updated frequently. Each year, new students are connected to INFLIBNET for easy access of study material. LCD Projectors are installed in 7 rooms. Seminars, conferences, workshops, meetings etc. were also conducted in hybrid mode. The college has an Internet registered domain viz. www.vkm.ac.in, which helps in providing e-mail facility to staff. The college has increased its broadband connections from 6 to 8 with speed of 100 mbps each. The college has purchased Quickheal Antivirus Total Security with validity of 3 years for the protection of the data. Old computers and their accessories are weeded out and sold to the scrap dealers. If the condition is good then the process of buyback is adopted. The college established a computer lab comprising 150 computers with intel core i5 processor, 2 online ups of 15KVA each along with 200 mbps per connection of 2 Wi-fi. Apart from this 49 other computers at 100 mbps per connection of Wireless Fidelity are there for official and academic purposes.

The institution has made adequate arrangements for the maintenance and upkeep of its infrastructure. Required funds are allocated for its maintenance. The Principal, on the basis of the prospective development plan, proposes the infrastructural augmentation requirements to the concerned authorities. The UGC sanctions funds

based on the requirements, student strength, and the nature of the academic programs offered by the institution. An effective monitoring system, through various committees, ensures the optimal utilization of budget allocated. The Building and Maintenance Committees oversee the requirements of the entire campus comprising the Principal, teachers and office staff. Computers and electronic devices are maintained and repaired through available funds. College website has also been upgraded to www.vkm.ac.in. Services of technician, electrician, carpenter and plumber are available as per requirement and through AMC. Maintenance of four laboratories, generators and computers is done by the respective departments and service providers. There is no major problem of voltage fluctuation in the college campus. However equipments like AC, refrigerator, photocopier machines and computers have voltage stabilizers or UPS installed along with them. For constant water supply, two submersible pumps of 3 & 1.5 hp are installed and 1 pump of 1.5hp is kept as standby. The College has 3 play grounds for organizing outdoor and Indoor games. The library has an Advisory Committee which consists of the Principal, Librarian, 6 faculty members, and one student representative. Regular meetings of the Committee are held where committee members provide valuable inputs for the better functioning of the library.

6.1.2 - The effective leadership is visible in various institutional practices such as decentralization and participative management.

The Principal, the College Committee, and IQAC streamline various organizational activities. The Heads of the departments in consultation with the faculty members, decide the distribution of syllabus, credits and classes and chalk out a plan for implementing various academic activities. The College schedules its academic plans and phases out teaching and examination programmes. At the beginning of the session, an academic calendar of the college is prepared in lieu with the academic calendar of BHU. The Principal holds a meeting with the Heads of departments and coordinators of committees, for the implementation of academic and cultural activities. The Heads there after hold a meeting with their faculty members and decide the distribution of syllabus, time-table, dates of submission of assignments, tests etc. Various academic and co-curricular programmes are formulated according to the College and University Guidelines. The college follows the "Performance Based Assessment System (PBAS) as per UGC/BHU norms. The University has developed an Academic Performance Indicator (API) system based on PBAS system of UGC. The College has adopted the practice of filling the Annual

Performance Appraisal Report (APAR) by faculty members and the Annual Confidential Report (ACR) by non-teaching staff. It has framed rules and guidelines for non-teaching staff and a system for recruitment/promotion. For assessing the annual performance of faculty members, feedback from students, teachers and alumni is analysed by the IQAC and Feedback Committee of the college. Faculty members, library and office staff are advised and assisted accordingly for better performance. The Institution maintains proper record of each and every transaction which is supported by bills and vouchers. All the transactions are made through cheques and TSA. Only duly authorized persons can operate the bank account. 6.5 - Internal Quality Assurance System

6.5.1 - Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has contributed significantly for institutionalizing the quality assurance strategies and processes

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has contributed significantly for institutionalizing the quality assurance strategies and processes. All academic and extra-curricular activities of the college are conducted under the aegis of IQAC. The members of IQAC are invited frequently for planning the academic activities, schedule for internal evaluation and action plans for improvement of teaching-learning process. The IQAC held meetings with the faculty, students, parents and alumni respectively wherein the feedback obtained from all the stake holders were discussed for monitoring and mentoring of academic and administrative activities. It has also formulated plans to sustain and nurture the Indian Knowledge System, in line with the NEP and Mission of the college. Career counselling programs are organized for students. Annual Performance Appraisal Report (APAR) of faculty members are verified by IQAC. It promotes interaction with industry and relevant programmes are organized. The IQAC encourages the staff to upgrade their knowledge and skills. In the session 2023-24, 27 conferences / seminars/ Webinars/Workshops, 87 lectures were organized by the College and 11 faculty members of the College attended faculty development programme and workshops. In this session, the faculty members of the College published 42 Research Papers in various UGC Care listed journals along with 4 Books and 16 Chapters in books. 19 MOUs with different organizations for academic and health care purposes were signed. Proposals for the following courses have been sent to the

concerned authority in Banaras Hindu University. All applications for promotion and recruitment for both teaching and non-teaching were scrutinized by the IQAC.

6.5.2 - The institution reviews its teaching learning process, structures & methodologies of operations and learning outcomes at periodic intervals through IQAC set up as per norms and recorded the incremental improvement in various activities

The institution reviews its teaching learning process, structures & methodologies of operations and learning outcomes at periodic intervals through IQAC according to norms and records the incremental improvement. The IQAC frequently assiststhe departments in planning the academic activities and the action plans for improvement of teaching-learning process and to monitor formative tests, their formats, frequencies and nature. The college follows semester system. In each semester, periodical evaluation of the student is obtained through summative and formative assessments. Regular assessment of students' performance is made through tests, assignments, practical & viva, presentations, classroom seminars, quiz sessions provide the feedback of students' strengths and weaknesses. This identification helps teachers to plan their lessons, teaching techniques and methods accordingly and overcome the barriers of learning. Mentoring is done according to students' requirement. This raises the level of the teaching-learning of the university curriculum that is implemented. IQAC also encourages inter-disciplinary lectures, workshops, field visits and sports & cultural activities for the benefit of students and faculty. Seminars, workshops, guest lectures, field visits, exhibitions are also organized from time to time. The IQAC holds meetings with the faculty for discussing students' feedback. Faculty members are required to fill the Annual Performance Appraisal Report (APAR) in which all their achievements are submitted. It has been found that there has been a significant improvement in the level of teaching, research, publications, organization of seminars, and other activities in recent years.

The college has implemented a comprehensive set of initiatives aimed at preserving the environment and promoting sustainability on its campus. The following is the list of initiatives:

1. **Solid Waste Management:** Regular burial of bio-degradable waste supports carbon neutrality and produces excellent manure for plants whereas waste recycling of waste paper using paper shredder contributes to paper waste reduction.
2. **E-waste management:** Recycling and disposal of non-biodegradable and e-waste is maintained by a dedicated committee. Also, internet usage, especially on social networking sites, is controlled by implementing strict policies indirectly promoting responsible electronic consumption.
3. **Hazardous waste management:** The campus has been declared a no polythene zone, reducing the use of hazardous plastic materials harmful to the environment, Students and staffs are encouraged to use eco-friendly modes of transportation.
4. **Liquid Waste management and water recycling:** Measures are taken to ensure water conservation. Water harvesting system has been installed to collect rainwater and to contribute to raising the underground water table. Non-portable water is used to nurture plants promoting lush greenery on campus while conserving water resources.
5. **Maintenance Committee:** This committee oversees cleanliness, waste disposal, and environmental initiatives on campus. They ensure that all waste types are managed properly and that environmental sustainability practices are upheld.

Title of the Practice: a) Sarjana b) Sanskrit Matri Mandalam

Objectives of the practices:

1. Overall development of the students and to establish a cultural and academic forum.
2. Nurturing the literary, musical and leadership skills of students, and providing them with opportunities to showcase talents and celebrate their achievements.

The Context:

1. In the early nineties, a group of teachers specially from the departments of Hindi, English and Sanskrit, felt a need to implore the creative minds of students and teachers, meeting frequently and rejuvenate themselves and together they formed the cultural forum 'Sarjana'.
2. Sanskrit Matri Mandalam established in 1991, a non-profit voluntary organization is being sustained entirely by VKM. It

was established to encourage students to know the rich heritage of classical language and to promote linguistic and cultural unity by reviving Sanskrit language.

Practices:

1. Sarjana organizes cultural and academic competitions for the students in various categories to give them a chance to showcase their talents from a set of choices i.e. logo making, cartoons strip, mehndi, business planning, essay writing, photography etc.
2. Year-long programmes are scheduled and implemented including a spoken Sanskrit session every month and a spoken Sanskrit workshop to help students express themselves in Sanskrit fluently.
