## Feedback of Faculty 2022-2023

### Feedback from Faculty 2022–23

According to the feedback from the faculty survey, it is clear that 97.3% of respondents accepted that the curriculum is structured, comprehensive, relevant, and arranged properly, of which 27.0% strongly agree and only 2.7% are neutral. 100% of respondents consider the relevance of the syllabus well defined for teachers and students. Similarly, 100% of respondents accepted that an updated list of study material for reference is provided by the teacher. 94.60% of respondents believe that a sufficient number of prescribed books are available in the library, of which 37.8% strongly agree, 2.7 disagree, and 2.7% are neutral. The majority of respondents (94.6%) accept that the course has a good balance between theory and application and increases their knowledge and perspective. In terms of teaching-learning approaches, all respondents believe that the approach is interactive and supportive (100%), of which 54.1% strongly agree and 45.9% agree. On the question of whether diverse teaching-learning methods like group discussion, class discussion, seminar presentations, participative learning, etc. are adopted to achieve intended learning outcomes, 74.0% strongly agree and 27% agree. 91.8% believe that the working environment is very supportive and friendly, of which 43.2% strongly agree and 48.6% agree with it, while 8.1% are neutral. The majority of the respondents (91.9%) accepted that infrastructure facilities such as classrooms, reading rooms, lab facilities, computer rooms, Wi-Fi facilities, etc. are good in the college, of which 18.9% strongly agree, 73.0% agree, 2.7% disagree, and 5.4% are neutral. 89.2% of teachers agree with the test and examination being conducted well in time with proper coverage of all units in the syllabus, of which 54.1% strongly agree, 2.7% disagree, and 8.1% are neutral. The majority (91.9%) of teachers accepted that the environment in the college is conducive and supportive to teaching and research, with 32.4% strongly agreeing and 59.5% agreeing with it, 2.7% disagreeing, and 5.4% being neutral with this question. On the question of providing support for research and projects, 94.6% of respondents are satisfied with the support system, of which 27% are strongly satisfied. 67.6% satisfied 2.7% are satisfied, and 2.7% are neutral. The majority of respondents (94.6%) believe that college provides adequate support for career advancement by upgrading skills and qualifications, of which 29.7% strongly agree and 5.4 are neutral. The majority of the respondents (97.3%) accepted that provision for professional development or career advancement is non-discriminatory and fair in college, of which 40.5% strongly agree and 56.8% disagree, and 2.7% are neutral.
