




2) Would you like to know about the activities of the college in future?



Out of those asked, 91.7% said yes to wanting to know about future college activities, while only 8.3% said no. This shows that the vast majority are interested in staying


informed about upcoming events, indicating a strong interest in staying connected with the college community.


4) If yes, name the examination and the year of qualifying it?


