

FACULTY FEEDBACK ON ACADEMICS & CURRICULUM

ANALYSIS OF FACULTY FEEDBACK ON ACADEMICS & CURRICULUM

According to the feedback from the faculty survey, it is clear that 95.3% of respondents accepted that the curriculum is structured, comprehensive, relevant, and arranged properly, of which 40.5% strongly agree and only 2.4% are disagree. 100% of respondents consider the relevance of the syllabus well defined for teachers and students, of which57.1% strongly agree. Similarly, 100% of respondents accepted that an updated list of study material for reference is provided by the teacher. 97.6% of respondents believe that a sufficient number of prescribed books are available in the library, of which 45.2% strongly agree, 2.4 disagree. Total no. of respondents (100%) accept that the course has a good balance between theory and application and increases their knowledge and perspective. In terms of teaching-learning approaches, all respondents believe that the approach is interactive and supportive (100%), of which 66.7% strongly agree and 33.3% agree. On the question of whether diverse teaching-learning methods like group discussion, class discussion, seminar presentations, participative learning,



etc. are adopted to achieve intended learning outcomes, 71.4% strongly agree and 28.6% agree. 97.6% believe that the working environment is very supportive and friendly, of which 47.6% strongly agree and 50.0% agree with it, while 2.4% are neutral. The majority of the respondents (97.6%) accepted that infrastructure facilities such as classrooms, reading rooms, lab facilities, computer rooms, Wi-Fi facilities, etc. are good in the college, of which 33.3% strongly agree, 64.3% agree, 2.4% disagree. All of teachers (100%) agree with the test and examination being conducted well in time with proper coverage of all units in the syllabus, of which 66.7% strongly agree, 33.3% are agree. The majority (95.2%) of teachers accepted that the environment in the college is conducive and supportive to teaching and research, with 45.2% strongly agreeing and 50.0% agreeing with it and 4.8% being neutral with this question. On the question of providing support for research and projects, 92.9% of respondents are satisfied with the support system, of which 31.0% are strongly satisfied, 61.9% satisfied, 4.8% are dissatisfied, and 2.4% are neutral. The majority of respondents (100%) believe that college provides adequate support for career advancement by upgrading skills and qualifications, of which 40.5% strongly agree and 59.5% are agree with it. All of the respondents (100%) accepted that provision for professional development or career advancement is non -discriminatory and fair in college. In this way it is cleared that most of respondents are satisfied with the academics and curriculum.
